Dress Code for Clubhouse and Course

The Clubhouse and Course shall be opened and closed at such hours as the Directors may determine. Members, their guests and visitors will observe and adhere to the following dress codes.

Clubhouse

Dress within the Clubhouse may be smart and casual; however at all times it must be sensible and conform to the standard expected of a Club with Duddingston's history and tradition.

- No football, rugby or beach shorts will be permitted.
- Shirts must be tucked into trousers.
- Tailored shorts (knee, or just above knee length) but not calf length may be worn on the Course and in the Clubhouse, with appropriate socks, but not after 7.00pm in the dining room. Ladies may wear tailored calf length trousers.
- Hats of any description, or waterproof clothing, will not be allowed in the bar or dining room.
- Trainers are not allowed.
- Golf shoes may be worn in the locker rooms and main hallway but not in the bar or dining room. It is expected that members, guests and visitors will make full use of the shoe cleaning facilities that are available.
- Members, guests and visitors have a responsibility of care for the lockers and furnishings within the Clubhouse. Members will not personalise any locker.
- No golfing equipment or sports bags shall be brought into the bar or dining room.
- No trolleys are allowed in the Clubhouse.
- Members, guests and visitors are expected at all times to demonstrate a high standard of behaviour, especially with regard to moderate language.
- Smoking is not permitted in any part of the Clubhouse including the main vestibules.

Course

Dress on the Course will be appropriate golf attire; as a guide, the standard of dress required is that of a professional or amateur golfer at their respective golf events. The following must not be worn on the Course;

Denim jeans, trainer type shoes, vests or similar styled tops, shell suits, track suits, rugby or football shirts, promotional or cult tee-shirts, crop tops.

Shirts and blouses must be tucked into trousers, shorts or skirts as appropriate and trousers must not be tucked into socks. Predominantly white or natural coloured socks must be worn with shorts. Only ladies may wear calf length trousers.
